HAZARDOUS MATERIALS COMMODITY FLOW STUDY

A hazardous materials (hazmat) commodity flow study (HMCFS) is a special kind of transportation analysis project. It is intended to identify the types and amounts of hazardous materials transported through our county



—and the routes used for transporting these commodities. It is a methodical way to identify and quantify the hazmat transportation hazards that may be present in our community. CERT along with Colleton County Fire-Rescue (CCFR) will participate in a HMCFS. We will monitor hazardous materials placards on tractor trailers traveling on five pre-selected highways and I-95 in Colleton County. CERT will be trained to collect data.

During our meeting on <u>February 19</u>, CERT will be trained for the study. If you signed up to essist in the study or

on the data collection process and discuss the plans for the study. If you signed up to assist in the study or would like to participate, it is very important for you to attend the training. The HMCFS will begin on February 25.

COOKING FIRES

Cooking is, by far, the leading cause of home fires and injuries. These fires caused an estimated 195 deaths, 3,800 injuries, and \$463 million in property loss each year. The leading specific factor contributing to ignition in nonconfined cooking fires in residential buildings was unattended equipment.
